

May Day Event



MUUF FAITH IN ACTION WITH MUUSAN

We have never experienced such challenges to democracy as we are seeing today, both in the U.S. and worldwide .

With the legislative session winding down, we have some good news to report. Together with our MUUSAN partner, League of Women Voters Maine, through testimonials and letter writing our denomination has helped get four bills signed by the governor:

LD 1779 - protection of ballots and voting devices

LD 1830 - election law amendments including allowed use of tribal ID's for voter registration and easier access to voting in nursing homes

LD 859 - ranked choice voting for municipalities

LD 1155 - post-election audits

Have you been curious about the petition to get the <u>Pine Tree Power</u> proposal on the ballot? You can learn more about the petition and why a Consumer-Owned Utility will be a better option for Maine than our current Invester— Owned Utilities (CMP & Versant) - both in terms of meeting our climate change goals and our economic well-being. There will also be information on the referendum campaign to get Pine Tree Power on the November 2023 ballot.

Youth activist Emily Rochford from Maine Youth for Climate Justice will introduce her organization and talk about their work.

Our break-out sessions will be different for this network meeting. You'll have the chance to ask more questions about the Pine Tree Power proposal and learn about how you can get more actively involved in the petition drive. There will also be a chance to discuss ways that MUUSAN can help partner with Maine youth in achieving climate justice for Maine. And there will be a third more general brainstorming Break Out session where you can share ideas about new climate change actions MUUSAN can get involved in.
