VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Would you be willing to volunteer to help do one of the following?

- **Zoom:** We are looking for two volunteers who are willing to take turns operating our Sunday Zoom sessions (start and stop the recording; admit and greet people joining us remotely). No prior experience is needed, and training is available. Doing so will enable the Fellowship to continue to enable people to join us remotely for Sunday services via Zoom through the summer. Otherwise we may have to take a break from live Zoom broadcasting starting June 19th.
- Bulk Supplies: We are looking for one volunteer who is willing to keep an eye on our bulk supplies for Sunday morning refreshments and periodically re-stock them when they get low. Supplies include paper goods, trash bags, and perhaps some basics such as coffee and filters. Checking the current inventory can be done quickly after Sunday services and items can be re-stocked the following Sunday. The Fellowship will reimburse associated expenses.
- **Pod Volunteers:** 18 generous members and friends have already signed up to join one of the five "pods" (teams) that we are forming. Team members help set up and put away materials and staging for our Sunday services. We would still like another 4 or 5 volunteers. Would you please be one?

Each year MUUSAN pays the registration fee for the Pride Portland parade and invites all Maine UU congregations to bring their congregational banner and march as a group. All MUUF members and friends are invited to join us on Saturday, June 18. The parade starts at 1 p.m., and the Pride Festival in Deering Oaks Park runs until 5 p.m. To start the day there will be a 10 a.m. interfaith pride service at First Parish UU Church in Portland, 425 Congress Street. First Parish will also be open for us to use the bathrooms and rest.



Here is the schedule:

10 a.m. Interfaith pride service at First Parish UU Church. Please wear masks inside the building.

11:15 a.m. UUs gather on the front steps of First Parish before moving to our spot in the parade.

11:30 a.m. Marchers begin lining up at an assigned location near Monument Square.

1 p.m. Pride Parade starts in Monument Square and ends about 45 minutes later in Deering Oaks Park, where the Pride Festival runs until 5 p.m.


It's Diaper Drive time again!!!
