Dear members and friends,

Each Sunday service is made possible by a series of small teams of volunteers (our "pods") who set things up before service, and put them away after the service. Each pod covers one Sunday per month. It's not a big job; a small team of three people can unlock the doors and do the setup in 15-20 minutes or so. Putting things away during the post-service social time is similar, with the final storage and locking up happening when the last attendees are leaving. The more people who are on a pod team, the easier it is for individual pod members to take a month off when they have another commitment.

Our current pods have been doing this for the past year and a few of their members need to step down. This is where we can use your help. Are you willing to lend a hand once a month? You won't be on your own; you'll be working with experienced pod team members.

Please consider adding your name to the volunteer sign up sheet on the table near our hymnals at the entrance to Porter Hall. The more volunteers we have, the easier it is to compensate when someone needs to take their usual week off. We need you.

Support Women's Reproductive Rights

The Christian Civic League swarmed the State House on May 1st in opposition to [LD 1619](#), *An Act to Improve Maine's Reproductive Privacy Laws*. Over 700 people made faith-based testimony against this critically important bill for women's health and reproductive rights. The sheer force of numbers has apparently caused some Democrats to waiver in their support. We need our faith-based support of this bill to be heard by our representatives.
