A five-session religious exploration program in feminist thealogy*

Presented on Zoom, **starting March 30, 6:30 p.m.**

"Women have no past, no history, no religion." Simone de Beauvoir, 1949

"Cakes for the Queen of Heaven: In Ancient Times" seeks to reclaim women's past, history, and religion. It invites participants to explore the religious myths and symbols

of the ancient world, where female images and experiences were central, and to examine the psychological and social importance of reclaiming our female religious heritage. It explores the provocative question: How might our world be different if the Divine was seen as female?

Among other topics, participants will honor the female form, study mother/daughter relationships, and look at women's power. This multi-sensorial learning experience will include story-telling and poetry, small group discussions (in breakout rooms), goddess images, art, music, and guided meditations.

This is the legislature's last week in "action," and there is a lot going on. Please <u>click here</u> for a list of the current bills that MUUSAN is supporting and action steps that you can take on their behalf. We had a brilliant Lobby Day last Wednesday in solidarity with the Wabanaki Alliance. There were 8 MUUSAN members among the over 100 supporters gathered at the state house. These bills are now out of committee and will be voted on shortly.

From Democracy in Action:

Update on bills: Now is the time to write to your legislators regardless of their committee assignments, asking them to support these bills, especially those on the Appropriations table. You can learn when certain bills will be taken up by Appropriations by signing up on their email list.
