April Vespers



The Passamaquoddy Tribe announced their Rally for Clean Drinking Water for Monday, April 11 at 8 a.m. starting with a press conference outside and then moving to lobbying legislators inside the State House. While the focus is on LD 906, we are also lobbying for LD 1626 (tribal sovereignty) and LD 585 (negotiated agreements with the governor that would give tribes oversight of online sports betting in Maine).
