IMPORTANT REMINDER

Please plan to attend a Special Meeting immediately following the service on Sunday, July 17th in Porter Hall of the Skidompha Library in Damariscotta for the purpose of voting on the following motion.



Proposed Motion: Authorize the Board of Trustees to hire Rev. Anne Bancroft as our quarter-time minister beginning August 1, 2022.

Note that the vote is to authorize hiring Anne for a 12-month term that will run from August 1, 2022 through July 31, 2023. We will likely amend the motion in the meeting to make that clear.

The meeting will start at approximately 11:30 AM and will hopefully be done by noon, depending on how much discussion people wish to have before we vote.

All members and friends of the Fellowship are welcome to attend the meeting, however voting will be limited to members. It is important that we have a strong turnout of our members so that we can meet the 40% quorum requirement specified in our bylaws. Please make it a point to attend in person or via Zoom using the link that will be provided for that Sunday's service. Note that if you have scheduling issues, you do not need to attend the worship service to attend this Special Meeting that follows it. The meeting will use the same Zoom link as the prior service.


