Dear Midcoast Members and Friends,

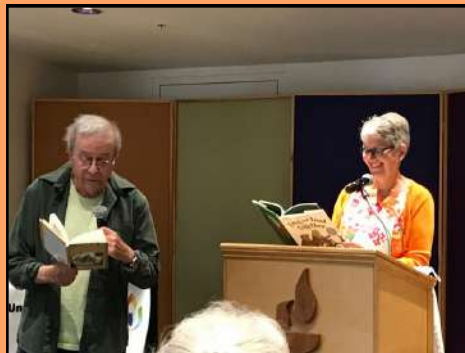
Thank you so much for the going away celebration after our service last Sunday! I ate chocolate cake for breakfast each day this week. 😊
