




Dear Midcoast friends,

Committee on Ministry

The Committee on Ministry (COM) has been meeting monthly since it was reactivated by the MUUF Board of Trustees in December 2021. With our Fellowship's recent shift to the new model of having Rev. Anne Bancroft with us quarter time and Revs. Donna Dolham and Ariel Aaronson-Eves joining us monthly, this seems like a good time to remind everyone of what the COM is and to be sure you know how and when to contact us.

A primary goal of MUUF's COM is to work collaboratively with Rev. Anne to help ensure her success in our Fellowship's shared ministries. The ministries of the Fellowship are shared by the professional staff, by the board of trustees, and by the committees and volunteers. We want to help ensure that all the ministries of the congregation remain on track and in alignment with MUUF's principles and purposes. We do this by checking in regularly with committee members, board members, the minister, and the Director of Religious Education. We also invite MUUF members and friends to reach out to us with concerns, questions, or suggestions about our shared ministries.

It is important to note that the COM is not primarily charged with conflict resolution. MUUF's congregational covenant asks that we all strive to communicate directly with honesty and respect, and to speak up when we are hurt. The COM is available to help when direct personal communication is not viable, is not desired by one of the parties, or requires support. In such cases we can serve as a sounding board or can suggest other resources that might be helpful.

The scope of the COM – looking at all the Fellowship's shared ministries – is large, but the size of our congregation makes this a reasonable charge. We ask that you help us by remembering MUUF's covenant in your interactions with others at Sunday services and in committee work. As the covenant reminds us, "We all share responsibility for upholding this covenant." We are grateful to have been entrusted with the responsibility of helping MUUF build and maintain our community.

WANTED - A FEW GOOD MEN TO JOIN A NEWLY FORMING MEN'S ANTIRACISM GROUP

Five women from our Fellowship have been part of an Antiracism reading and training group with a skilled Diversity Trainer since the murder of George Floyd 2 years ago. This has opened our minds and hearts about how we have participated in harming others by our own racism, that we didn't even know we had! Here is an opportunity for men in our Fellowship to do the same. It is time!

The group will be on Zoom and led by Paul Sanderson and Leigh Anne Keichline, 2 veteran educators. Through bite-sized readings, videos, or other media, each session will be structured by experience facilitators. While many of the materials and discussions will help us to think about race and racism, it will also make space for intersecting topics (gender, ableism, LGBTQ, classism, etc.). This will be a safe/brave space within this small group to learn, listen, question, grow together, and share our experiences and perspectives.
